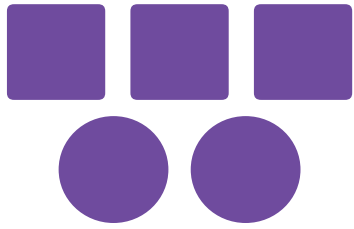

Dr. Ernest Rip Patton, Jr. North Nashville Transit Center

This Transit Center is a new WeGo development at 26th Avenue and Clarksville Highway. It will have an air-conditioned waiting room, restrooms, Wi-Fi, and multiple bus bays to connect several routes across town. It is part of an overall effort to increase access to public transit across Nashville while reducing the necessity of transferring Downtown at the Elizabeth Duff Transit Center at WeGo Central.

Project Update

Building Area

- Accordion and storefront doors are being installed in the transportation center's bay or lobby area.
- Various interior finishes are being completed throughout the transit center, such as restroom tile, epoxy flooring, and LVT flooring.

Plaza Area

- Art curation is ongoing, including preparation for the historic plaques. Artist Woke Three is currently painting "Voices of the Future" mural where outdoor events will take place.
- Irrigation has been installed where trees have been planted.

Bus Lanes

- Low Voltage is being installed at each bus canopy location to allow access for ADA push buttons, audio visual wiring, and other transit amenities.
- Canopies located in the bus lane area, ACM panels and lighting are being installed.

Right of Way

- The inbound canopy of Clarksville Pike is about 89 percent complete, including structural steel completion, concrete placement completion, and ongoing lighting rough in.
- Sidewalks along the inbound location on Clarksville Pike are complete and allow pedestrians space to utilize the temporary WeGo transit stops.
