WeGo Access public meetings scheduled for May 16 and 18

NASHVILLE – WeGo Public Transit underwent a review of its WeGo Access and is now seeking input from the public about specific proposals during two hybrid public meetings in May. The meetings will occur as follows:

- Tuesday, May 16 from 4:30 to 6 p.m., Nashville Downtown Library, 615 Church St.
- Thursday, May 18 from 10 to 11:30 a.m., East Park Community Center, 600 Woodland St.

Access eligible riders can attend the meetings for free by using the usual scheduling process. Both meetings will be livestreamed on the WeGo Facebook page at: facebook.com/WeGoTransit.

WeGo Access is publicly funded paratransit service which offers specialized vans for persons with disabilities who are unable to use fixed-route transit service.
