WeGo proposes service changes for Fall 2022 *Public meetings scheduled for July 21 through August 2*

NASHVILLE – WeGo Public Transit will have an open public comment period for proposals to adjust public transit service in Nashville in response to ridership needs, starting Tuesday, July 12 through Tuesday, August 2, 2022. During this time, customers will be able to view proposed service changes, participate in meetings to provide comment directly to WeGo staff members, and submit feedback via mail, phone, and email as the agency works to ensure the changes proposed will meet the needs of the communities served.

Proposed Fall service changes

Route adjustments

- 6 Lebanon Pike – change routing from downtown to Hermitage Avenue
- 9 MetroCenter – change routing from downtown to Germantown
- 29 Jefferson – change routing to and from downtown to use Rosa L. Parks Boulevard instead of Rep. John Lewis Way
- 41 Golden Valley – change routing to and from downtown and Jefferson Street
- 77 Thompson/Wedgewood – eliminate deviation on Glenrose Avenue to Greentree Terrace Apartments
- 79 Skyline – only serve Skyline Hospital on eastbound trips to Gallatin Pike
- 88 Dickson – add stop at Bellevue Park & Ride
- WeGo Link – expand zone in Antioch and expand service to south Nashville, Hermitage, and Goodlettsville
