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## **WeGo proposes service changes for Spring 2023** *Public meetings scheduled for January 24, 25, and 26*

**NASHVILLE** – In a continuation of efforts to adjust public transit service in Nashville and Middle Tennessee in response to ridership needs, WeGo Public Transit will have an open public comment period starting Tuesday, January 17 through Tuesday, February 7, 2023.

During this time, customers will be able to view proposed service changes, participate in meetings to provide comment directly to WeGo staff members, and submit feedback via mail, phone, and email as the agency works to ensure the changes proposed will meet the needs of the communities served.

### **New Proposed Spring Service Changes**

The proposed spring service changes would feature the following adjustments:

#### **Route adjustments**

- 18 Airport – change downtown routing and add local service on all trips from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. on weekends
- 19 Herman – take routing off Batavia
- WeGo Link – expand service to Bellevue, Cockrill Bend, and Sylvan Park

#### **Schedule adjustments**

#### **Extending span of service to 10 p.m.**

Some previously proposed frequency and span of service changes for routes 3, 4, 7, 8, 22, 23, 50, 52, 55, 56, 75, and 77 (except later night service) have been delayed as focus turns to maintaining service reliability while addressing these challenges to ensure effective delivery of service.
