# WeGo service changes go into effect April 2 Changes include route, schedule adjustments

**NASHVILLE** – Effective Sunday, April 2, 2023, WeGo Public Transit will implement system-wide service changes that include route adjustments, schedule adjustments, and expanded service hours. These changes reflect customer input and community feedback and were approved by the Nashville Metropolitan Transit Authority (Nashville MTA) Board on February 23.

### Route adjustments

- 3 West End— change routing from downtown on White Bridge Road to left on Charlotte, right on Midland, right on O'Brien, and right on White Bridge to the end of the line
- 18 Airport change express routing to downtown to continue on I-24 West to James Robertson Parkway; change local and express routing from downtown to Rosa L. Parks Boulevard/8<sup>th</sup> Avenue to Lafayette Street
- 19 Herman change routing from Batavia to Albion
- WeGo Link expand service to Bellevue, Cockrill Bend, and Sylvan Park
