New fares for WeGo bus service in effect August 2 Fare changes affect fixed-route bus, Access and Access on Demand

NASHVILLE – On Friday, August 2, the costs for WeGo Public Transit's fare and multi-day passes will increase for the first time since 2012.

In June, the agency's Board of Directors approved recommended service and fare change proposals. Beginning August 2, each one-way trip on regular bus service will be \$2.00 and prices for all multi-day passes, including discounted passes, will be adjusted accordingly as outlined below.

Changes to WeGo's paratransit service fares include an increase from \$3.40 to \$3.70 per trip for the agency's traditional Access service, and an increase from \$6.00 to \$7.00 for the first 14 miles for WeGo's Access-on-Demand service.

Change cards, originally proposed to be eliminated in conjunction with the fare increase, will now continue to be issued until December 31, 2020.
